Approval of Minutes

Minutes from August 2020 approved.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report was made by Carolyn Doherty. As of August 31st, general account balance is \$31,544.11, golden account balance is \$23,062.23, and investment account balance is \$895.15. There are currently around \$5,558 in pending expenses. The expenses do not include Sioux Falls expenses. Colorguard expenses were \$3,320 for the outfits and back packs were extra. There are 12 colorguard students. Their registration cost was set at \$190. If \$80 went toward the same expenses as other Band Camp students, then \$110 each paid by students to cover the cost of their uniforms. For 12 students, this totals \$1,320. Boosters agreed to pay half of uniform cost, but are paying more. The individual registration forms for colorguard and all band members for Band Camp have been requested and are needed to track expense categories in general and also to determine which students have not yet paid registration fees. Also, donations for water and snacks were included on the registration forms. For 2021-22, Band Boosters need to work more closely with Band Camp organizer and colorguard coaches to establish a budget for the year.

Directors' Reports

Mr. Rohlfs: Thanks to all for help with Nebraska City. Students did a great job.

Mr. Senff: Nebraska City Applejack parade was this past weekend, all went very well. Middle school now has equipment it needs to practice indoors. Middle school concerts communicated to parents and on website. Fifth grade instrument night on Mon, 9/28. Went out by email and packet going home with students by end of this week.

Fundraising Report

The fundraising report was delivered by Tami Prang. She is going through golden accounts for students, who graduated last year and looking for siblings to apply unused funds before moving them to the general fund.

Frisbee Golf: Only one registration, need to advertise. No food trucks set up, Kelli Rohlfs helping with this, planning on setting up in Wayne Park. The date chosen is a Husker game day.

The event starts at 11am for the first round and the second round starts at 2pm. Need to promote among students. Band Expo 2.0 that night at 7pm at Viking Stadium.

Golf Tournament at Woodland Hills: Look at for spring date later in October, start advertising in spring.

Tag app: Opportunity for receipt to be scanned and band gets credit for it. Kelli Rohlf may have more information on this.

Concessions: Carolyn Doherty will check with Brad McMillan, but it appears as if concessions will now be offered in Viking Stadium. Assistance need on Thurs, 9/24 at 4:30pm for volleyball concessions. Also need approval for band students to assist with stadium clean up as a fundraiser from Brad McMillan.

Soup supper is still TBD and no plans are currently being made. If it happens, typically scheduled for second Saturday in February (2/13). Still not clear if we will be able to do this with COVID restrictions. Consider broadcasting on strive network? Call in donations?

Student Representatives Report

Nebraska City went well, students are practicing hard and looking forward to upcoming events including Sioux Falls competition. Band day tomorrow (9/22) and students are excited about the clinician coming to provide them with feedback.

Other Discussion Items

Middle School Concerts: If COVID meter for Lancaster County is yellow or orange, then only family members can attend; if green, others can attend as well.

Sioux Falls: Two boxed meals (Subway, Slim Chickens) will be provided to students for lunch and dinner, respectively. Parent volunteers will be asked to bring their own sack lunches; meals will not be provided. Though volunteer help is needed and appreciated, Band Boosters need to be conservative with funds this year, especially since it is unlikely that they will be able to hold Soup Supper, their largest fundraiser of the year. Currently, there are 17 parents signed up to help with pit and 4-5 for props. Need to determine if there are limits on number who can assist. At this time, no spectators are allowed in the stadium.
